Alvie C. Richardson, MD, FACOG

Dr. Richardson earned a bachelor's degree in biology from the University of Nevada and a medical degree from the University of Nevada, School of Medicine, where he also underwent a year of residency training in family medicine. He completed residency training in obstetrics and gynecology at the University of Nebraska Medical Center and the University of Texas Southwestern Medical Center. He completed a fellowship in maternal-fetal medicine at Warren Alpert School of Medicine at Brown University where he then held the position of clinical instructor in the department of Obstetrics and Gynecology for three years. Following that, he held the position of assistant professor in the department of Obstetrics and Gynecology at Oklahoma University Health Sciences Center until he moved to Oregon in 2010 to join the Willamette Health Partners Maternal-Fetal Medicine in Salem, Ore.

During his years of teaching at Oklahoma University Health Sciences Center, Dr. Richardson was given special recognition and received the Faculty Teaching Award "For Excellence in Teaching Medical Students for the Year" in 2008 and 2009. He also received the Association of Professors of Gynecology and Obstetrics Excellence in Teaching Award in 2009.

Dr. Richardson is certified by the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology with an additional subspecialty in maternal-fetal medicine. His clinical areas of interest include stillbirth, twin-to-twin transfusion syndrome, gestational diabetes mellitus and ultrasound.

Marvin Williams, DO, FACOG

Dr. Williams earned a medical degree from Oklahoma State University College of Osteopathic Medicine. He completed an internship in obstetrics and gynecology at William Beaumont Army Medical Center at Fort Bliss in Texas. He completed residency training at Fort Bliss and Ohio State University, where he also completed a fellowship in maternal-fetal medicine. He worked as an adjunct clinical instructor in Obstetrics and Gynecology, Division of Maternal-Fetal Medicine at Ohio State University on completing fellowship training.

Dr. Williams has served in various military operations and locations including Camp Hialeah Clinic Pusan in Korea, Eisenhower Army Medical Center in Georgia, Wright Patterson Air Force Base in Ohio, Squadron Surgeon in Operation Iraqi Freedom, V Havoc Troop in Iraq, and as the chief of obstetrical services at Fort Bragg in North Carolina. He is currently an assistant professor in Obstetrics and Gynecology, Division Maternal-Fetal Medicine at the University of Oklahoma Medical Center and is the Director of Clinical Services in Maternal Fetal Medicine. He has received many honors and awards including the Bronze Star Medal in 2008.

Dr. Williams is certified by the American Board of Obstetrics and Gynecology with an additional subspecialty in maternal-fetal medicine. His clinical areas of interest include preterm labor, diabetes in pregnancy and prenatal diagnosis. He has many published works and enjoys the role of lecturer and teacher.
