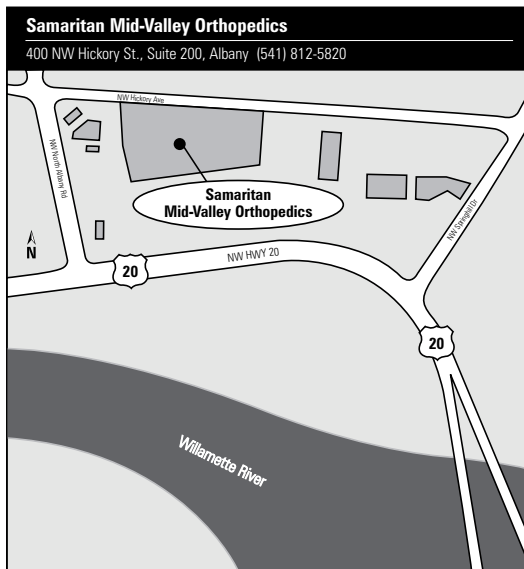


Insurance and billing

We provide general and specialized orthopaedic surgery services including joint replacement, ACL reconstruction, joint injections, rotator cuff repair, endoscopic carpal tunnel surgery, arthroscopic knee and shoulder surgeries, and sports medicine.

We are committed to providing high-quality, compassionate care to all our patients, which is evident through two special programs: a Fracture Clinic and a comprehensive Joint Replacement Program.

Fracture Clinic

Based out of Samaritan Mid-Valley Orthopedics, the Fracture Clinic provides a place for patients who have experienced a fracture, sprain or dislocation that does not require surgery to receive timely and consistent orthopaedic care. A physician referral is required for the Fracture Clinic.

Joint Replacement Program

This collaborative program between our clinic, Samaritan Albany General Hospital and Samaritan Rebound Physical Therapy, focuses on educating patients prior to surgery about joint replacement surgery and the recovery process. Patients with surgeries around the same time attend class together to build camaraderie and support. In addition to the education provided in class, patients will also meet the staff that will be serving them during their hospital stay. While in the hospital

patients participate in therapy and activities together and encourage one another in the recovery process.
