After all, these generous people were instrumental in securing more than \$7 million to furnish and equip our lovely new building!

Who doesn't love a behind-the-scenes tour of areas not normally open to the public – such as the spacious surgical suites, the high-tech emergency department, the sparkling commercial kitchen, and more? Of course, the hospital is not entirely completed until existing medical equipment is moved from the old hospital into the new, which means some of the areas were still a bit bare. However, the overwhelming sentiment was of awe and appreciation of a job well done.

By the way, those "bare areas" will begin to fill in when Materials Management, Environmental Services, Nutrition Services and the Laboratory begin moving into their spaces the week of Jan. 27.

Prepared to give quality care: Not only does the building look beautiful, thanks to the fantastic work done by the design-build team of Skanska USA Building and HGA Architects, city and state inspectors and surveyors are ensuring that the building is safe for patient care and that our employees are prepared to give cohesive care from one department to another. On Dec. 19, the City of Lincoln City granted a temporary certificate of occupancy. From Jan. 6 to 7, the Oregon Health Authority facilities survey was met with success, and the OHA licensure survey is planned for Jan. 21 to 23. These surveys assure that we are "team ready" to care at the highest level.
