WISHES, WANTS AND NEEDS

In mid-January, our design-build team, HGA and Skanska, presented the SNLH executive team with an initial construction budget based on the “dream big” list of wishes, wants and needs. This list was developed after many brainstorming sessions and individual meetings with staff, community members and others over several weeks this past fall.

The next task is to cut this costly list down to an affordable and feasible budget. This doesn’t mean all the “wishes” are automatically discarded, but it does mean that choices must be made. This is normal during the predesign process of a major project. All ideas, big and small, were encouraged so that no great idea would be overlooked.

SHARING LEAN PROJECTS WITH SPCH

The “lean team” is finishing up its priority list of process improvement projects and hopes to share this list with Samaritan Pacific Communities Hospital for possible collaboration. “Lean” is a methodical process used in many industries (including health care) to maximize customer value by eliminating waste and increasing efficiency.

INTERIOR DESIGN INTRODUCED

The interior finishes for all new Samaritan construction, including the two new coastal hospitals, have been introduced. Spiral Design Elements in Corvallis developed the system-wide standard for interior design, including a color palette. This was shared with HGA designers as well as designers with The Neenan Co., the architectural firm working on the new hospital project in Newport.

- Requests for proposals are being prepared for wayfinding and other signage, medical equipment, food service equipment and post-occupancy support.
