Sitework underway for replacement hospital building

Anyone who has been near Samaritan North Lincoln Hospital in recent days is very aware: construction on the 52,000-square-foot replacement hospital has begun!

- Construction fencing was erected around the site on July 9. It extends south of the helipad, along the east face of the hospital building, through the south parking lot, along 28th Street and back north to the helipad. A demonstration landing at the helipad was successfully conducted to ensure safe and timely landings with minimal disruption to site workers.
- Erosion control, storm water management and tree protection measures have been put in place by the general contractor, Skanska USA Building.
- A subcontractor, Knottworks Construction, is clearing and grubbing the site—including removal of trees and landscaping, asphalt, concrete, light fixtures and more. By the way, tree felling is complete, and the memorial bench and memorial plaque that had been located outside the Family Birthing Center have been removed by SNLH Engineering for safekeeping.
- Site excavation has begun, as well. A large excavator has begun digging into the soil at the north end of the project site and is filling endless dump-truck loads of dirt to be carried off campus.

HPEC remodeling

An important part of the replacement hospital project is remodeling the Health Professions Education Center (HPEC) to include clinical and administrative spaces. The design package for this project was submitted to the Oregon Health Authority last month, with comments returned. Staff from HGA Architects and Engineers will submit responses to the comments this week.

Construction camera follows progress

Even if you don't have an office window overlooking the site, you can follow the project's progress. No safety vest or hardhat required—just visit samhealth.org/NewHospitalLincolnCity. A construction camera shoots a photo every 30 minutes so you can watch a time-lapse video.
